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Maths AQA Entry Level Mrs Diapouli	Pupils have completed the geometry unit looking at symmetry; nets of shapes; angles and lines: grid co-ordinates and direction. This term they will start to work on the final unit 'Statistics'. Pupils will develop their knowledge and understanding of reading, creating and interpreting different types of data, graphs and charts. Science Miss Postans Mr Goodchild	During term 3 Pupils will be completing the Physics Topic 'Energy, Forces and the Structure of Matter.' Pupils will be completing an experiment to find out how the speed of a trolley changes as it travels down a slope along with finding out about how the braking distance of a car is affected by various factors such as tyres, road conditions and the reaction times of the driver. The unit will finish with pupils learning about radioactive particles and where they come from. Moving into Term 4 pupils will be completing their last topic 'Environment, evolution and inheritance' where they will be learning about ecosystems, and what affects them along with how we inherit features from our parents and how these lead onto species changing over time.	When driving, discuss how you need to keep a safe distance between you and the next car and why you increase this when the road is wet or slippery. You could also look at the animals you can spot in the garden or local park and what features they have to help them survive, such as a fur to keep them warn in winter. 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R&W Mrs Petrie	This term, pupils will be working towards completing the Pre- Entry Level AQA Unit 73925: Introduction to Buddhism. The unit provides a gentle introduction to the key beliefs, teachings, and practices of Buddhism, helping pupils gain an understanding of this major world religion. Pupils will learn about the life of Siddhartha Gautama (the Buddha), the Four Noble Truths, and the Eightfold Path, exploring how these teachings guide Buddhists in their daily lives. They will also look at symbols and rituals associated with Buddhism, such as meditation and mindfulness, and how these practices are used to promote inner peace and compassion. Activities will focus on building understanding through discussion, creative tasks, and reflective exercises.	You can support your child's learning by encouraging them to share what they have learned about Buddhism, such as its teachings on mindfulness and compassion. Reading simple stories about the Buddha or exploring mindfulness activities together can also enhance their understanding and engagement with this topic. PE Mr Altman	During this term, pupils will focus on developing a routine in trampolining. They will design a 6 to 8 bounce routine and sequence it into a performance. Pupils will perform a variety of skills they have learned in previous years, including pike, straddle, tuck, seat landing, and twist. These techniques will be combined to form a fluid routine that demonstrates their ability to control and execute movements. Additionally, pupils will have the opportunity to analyse the performances of their peers. They will assess what went well and identify areas for improvement in others' routines, helping to develop their critical thinking and self-reflection skills. 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IT Mr Altman	This term, pupils will focus on developing their skills in data management using Microsoft Excel. They will learn how to input, sort, and manipulate data effectively, focusing on creating tally charts based on real-life information. Using this data, pupils will then create a variety of charts, including pie, line, and bar charts, to represent the information visually. Through these activities, pupils will gain a deeper understanding of how to work with data in a practical context and how to present information clearly and accurately using spreadsheet software. Music Mrs Lea	In Music this term, pupils will be extending their learning and understanding of Rhythm and Pulse. Pupils will be reminded of the importance of pulse as a fundamental upon which music is built and performed. Through the integrated activities of performing, composing and listening, pupils will develop their own feeling for and awareness of a regular pulse. Pupils will be able to make a clear distinction between pulse and rhythm and learn to use rhythm grids as a method of recording rhythm patterns. Pupils will perform and compose rhythm patterns of differing complexity including rests, half-beats and accents.	When listening to music at home, encourage your child to 'feel' the beat . 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ELV Mrs Weston	This term pupil's will be continuing to work towards the Roadwise ASDAN short course. As part of this we will complete the Gloucestershire Fire and Rescue Services 'Passenger intervention' programme. This will help the pupils to understand safer driving practices, including the influence they as a passenger can have on driver focus and safety. It will also cover critical risks like speeding, mobile phone use, seatbelt use, and impaired driving. The pupils will also plan, organise and create a risk assessment for a local outing using public transport which we will then undertake. This will involve them using the local bus timetables and looking at the feasibility of some of the places they would like to visit.	Parents & carers can support their children by starting to involve them when planning journeys and talking about the different hazards on the road when travelling or walking. 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Arts Award (Art and Drama) Miss Price	In art and drama lessons, pupils are working towards Arts Award Explore (Entry Level 3 qualification.) During term 3, pupils will firstly be creating props for their puppet show performance, and rehearsing and performing their puppet show. During term 4, in drama pupils will be learning about theatre around the world, including French mime and the mime artist Marcel Marceau, Italian Commedia Del'arte, Chinese dragon dancing, Japanese storytelling dance/mime, African Anansi folk tales, and Indonesian shadow puppets. In art, pupils will be studying a topic about Beetles and Bugs. Pupils will learn about the work of Rosalind Monks and her beautiful, intricate, patterned beetles. They will work in both their sketchbooks and on a larger scale using inks, collage, metallic pens, and watercolour pencils to create large beetles, butterflies, and bugs.
